



PARABLE OF THE PHARISEE AND THE PUBLICAN

(Luke 18, 9-14)

Two Men, Two Prayers, Two Attitudes, Two Verdicts.

God's righteousness versus Man's Rightousness

It is true that going out on to the street implies the risk of accidents happening, as they would to any ordinary man or woman. But if the church stays wrapped up in itself, it will age. And if I had to choose between a wounded church that goes out on to the streets and a sick, withdrawn church, I would definitely choose the first one.

MESSAGE FROM THE PARISH PRIEST:

<u>Today's Gospel Reading</u> tells us the story of two men who went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing by himself, thanked God he wasn't like some other people and then made a list of his many virtues. The tax collector, standing at the back, didn't even feel worthy enough to raise his eyes to God but kept beating his breast and saying, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" Jesus says, "I tell you, this man went back home justified rather than the other."

<u>The first reading</u> highlights how God hears the prayer of the humble, "The man who with his whole heart serves God will be accepted, his petitions will carry to the clouds. The humble man's prayer pierces the clouds ... and the Lord will not be slow".

In the second reading, Paul begins with what seems to be a boast, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." This wasn't boasting. Paul was simply stating the direction his life took after meeting the risen Jesus on the road to Damascus. Paul also knew that it wasn't his own strength that enabled him to follow Jesus. Rather, as he acknowledges at the end of the 2nd reading, "The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and save me for his heavenly kingdom.

<u>Today</u> we come to this table to celebrate God's role in our lives. At the beginning of Mass each week we say, "Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy". We acknowledge God's Merciful Love in our lives once again, and we experience the strength that comes from him. What word or phrase from the readings will you carry with you this week? May it be "God will take your petitions to the clouds. The humble man's prayer pierces the clouds", or "I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from all evil attempts on me, and bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom." Or, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner".

SYNOD 2020 NEXT STEPS: At the end of September, all the Synod Members gathered at 'The Edge' in Wigan to receive the report from the listening stage of our Synod journey and hear the announcement of the four themes that have emerged from all the listening that took place from February to July.

Over 20,000 people took part in the listening- in parishes, schools, online and in focus groups. All this information was read and sent to Hope University and under the guidance of Fr Peter McGrail was presented to the Synod working party in August and after 3 days of prayer and discernment four themes emerged. You can read the full report (130 pages) on the Synod website. These four themes will give us all the opportunity to listen some more, reflect and then make proposals for action for the Synod, which will be voted on and guide the Archbishop in writing a Pastoral Plan for the Archdiocese.

The four themes are:

- All called and gifted by God
- Sharing the mission of Jesus
- How we pray together
- Building Community, nurturing belonging.

The Synod is a great act of faith and once again we encourage you all to take an interest and respond as and when you feel able.

After discussing this next phase, we have decided invite you to reflect over the coming months on each of the four themes in turn.
